# Essential Cotton Fabrics (Best for Almost Any Project)

- Cotton: Lightweight, breathable, and easy to sew. Ideal for casual wear, home decor, and quilting.
- Cotton Poplin: Smooth, crisp, and easy to handle. Ideal for blouses, dresses, and lightweight shirts.
- Chambray: Light and breathable like denim, perfect for shirts, skirts, and dresses.
- Broadcloth: Lightweight and tightly woven. Best for shirts, skirts, and dresses.
- Cotton Lawn: Soft, lightweight, and perfect for dresses, tops, and skirts.
- Cotton Voile: Lightweight and slightly sheer. Great for summer tops and dresses (may need lining).
- Brushed Cotton: Soft and cosy. Ideal for pajamas, shirts, and blankets.
- Gingham: Woven checked cotton fabric. Perfect for dresses, shirts, and skirts.
- Muslin: Inexpensive cotton fabric used for testing garments. Great for practicing sewing techniques.



### Linen & Blended Fabrics (Breathable & Easy to Work With)

- Linen: Breathable and perfect for summer clothes like dresses and shirts. Can be tricky due to wrinkles and fraying.
- Linen-Cotton Blend: Easier to sew, wrinkles less, and great for lightweight dresses and skirts.
- Double Gauze: Soft and crinkly fabric, great for baby clothes, dresses, and tops.



## Sturdier Cotton Fabrics (For More Structured Projects)

- Twill: Durable with a slight diagonal weave. Perfect for skirts, jackets, and trousers.
- Seersucker: Puckered cotton, great for summer dresses, shirts, and shorts.
- Denim (Light to Medium Weight): Lighter denim is beginnerfriendly for skirts, dresses, and lightweight jackets.
- Canvas: Sturdy and holds its shape. Ideal for tote bags, home decor, and structured garments.
- Duck Cloth: Softer than canvas, great for aprons, bags, and cushion covers.
- Corduroy: Textured fabric with ridges. Great for trousers, skirts, and jackets.



# Beginner-Friendly Knit Fabrics (Soft, Stretchy & Easy to Wear)

- Cotton Jersey: Stable and easy to handle. Perfect for t-shirts, dresses, and leggings.
- Ponte Roma: Soft, stable knit fabric that doesn't curl. Ideal for skirts, dresses, and trousers.
- Sweatshirt Fleece: Soft with a fleecy back. Great for hoodies and loungewear.
- French Terry: Lighter than sweatshirt fleece, perfect for joggers, hoodies, and dresses.



### **Soft & Plush Fabrics (For Cosy Projects)**

- Fleece: Soft, warm, and doesn't fray. Great for hoodies, jackets, and blankets.
- Terry Cloth: Easy to sew, great for bathrobes, beach cover-ups, and baby bibs.
- Quilted Fabric: Pre-quilted fabric makes jacket, gilet, and coat projects easier.



# Specialty & Coated Fabrics (For Bags & Home Decor)

- Oilcloth: Waterproof and easy to sew, perfect for tablecloths, aprons, and bags.
- Waxed Cotton: Waterproof and easy to sew. Great for jackets, bags, and hats.
- Velveteen: Cotton-based fabric with a velvet look. Ideal for special occasion garments.
- Canvas: Sturdy and holds its shape. Ideal for tote bags, home decor, and structured garments.
- Felt: Doesn't fray and easy to sew. Great for crafts, bags, and decorations.
- Vinyl: Durable and water-resistant. Best for bags and wallets (use a Teflon or walking foot for easy sewing).
